PROGRAM AND OFFICE UPDATES:

GRASP (Greenfield After School Program):

• Next week, the Recreation Department will be reaching out to those who worked last year and posting for positions openings. The Department will be preparing the enrollment packets for families soon.

CAMP:

• The Recreation Department is half way through the summer! The camps have been going well – considering the lack of water access and the number of times the campers and staff have been in the middle school. Families have shared lots of positive feedback and this week is Gross Out Week which the kids love. Shayla even had worms on her face today – YUCK! Next week is one of the bigger field trips to the Mystic Aquarium.

Start Smart Soccer:

• Soccer make up night is tonight and the Recreation Department has a full program with 20 enrolled.

Learn to Play Pickleball:

• This program has been so popular that Shayla has scheduled a second session on July 29th.

Tennis Lessons:

- The Department is only offering youth lessons, although enrollment is low. Shayla will be marketing these tomorrow.

Shattuck Park fitness cluster install, concrete work ADA compliant high school track, pickleball feasibility, Americorps help with Highland trail, site amenities throughout downtown Greenfield, Bocce court at Beacon, and Highland trail signs.
- Abercrombie Field and parking arrangements for baseball practices and games given new ownership of former Greenfield Center School and renovation/development
- Parks tour for Commissioners
- Find Triathlon volunteers who can take over some of the more physical needs of the committee during race week as current dedicated volunteers are aging and need to train new members.
- Review the leases for various parks including Abercrombie, Lunt, and Murphy.
- Connect Mark Lombard of New England Mountain Biking (used to be on the Recreation Commission) with Kim to network with him about NEMBA grants, etc. for Highland Park trail improvements.
- Propose ideas for the Sustainable Greenfield Committee position to Christy.
- Work with Eric about the City's recent ownership of a 13 acres parcel and an easement to the surrounding six acres (there's also a house there that someone recently bought at auction) in Highland Park- check in on this in Spring 2023.
